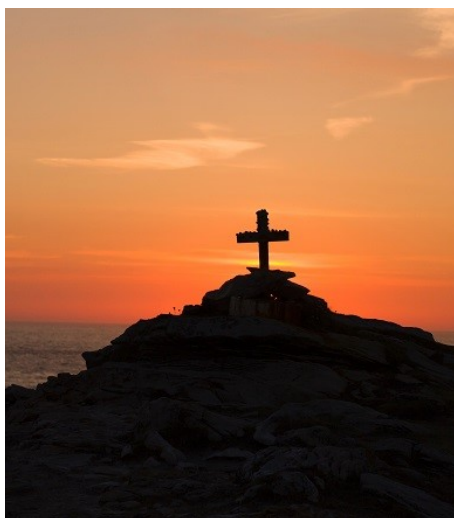

From the Acting Vicar

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It has been many years since I last acted as the Locum Priest in this parish, when I lived on the border of Glen Iris and East Malvern. So, in spite of the long distance between here and Frankston it is good to be back here among you between your last Acting Vicar and your next one (which my advanced age and the distance to be travelled, would have precluded any more extended locum activity here by me!)

It is good to be able to celebrate with you the passion (suffering) and death of our Lord Jesus this last week, and to celebrate with you His resurrection this Sunday. While I will be reflecting with you this Sunday on one piece of historical evidence for Jesus' resurrection, I would also like in this note briefly to reflect more broadly on this central part of our Christian faith.

For some the very strong historical argument for Jesus' resurrection is decisive for their belief. But for some the most decisive reason for believing in His resurrection is their personal experience of Him in their prayer life and/or some event or events in their life. For some the most decisive reason for believing in Him as their risen Lord is what they read in the Gospels, for they find that no one could speak and act like this unless He truly is the Lord. Some of us would have more than one of these reasons, and certainly all are important.

Our efforts so far have been fruitful with the Member for Richmond writing on our behalf to the Minister for Creative Industries to inform Parliament about the whereabouts and condition of the original instrument. Through John and Calvin we have an extraordinary group of benefactors and supporters, including the Myer family and the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra. I shall keep you updated with our progress.

³⁴ Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵ but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶ You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. ³⁷ That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹ We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem.
