From the Vicar

Notes from the National Capital.

This week I have been in Canberra lecturing and meeting people at the ANU. It is always a busy but enjoyable and productive time. This visit was no different.

On Tuesday I met with Professor Quentin Grafton, the UNESCO Water Professor from the Crawford School of Public Policy. This was primarily to map out a plan for my Associate Professorship which will see us taking the Aquawhen Exhibition around Australia between 2023 and 2025 and producing a documentary of that process. This is an extension of my/our work on the water of life, a suitable spiritual metaphor, which is the Baaka (Darling) and the Martuwarra (Fitzroy) Rivers. We also discussed the development of a short video on the Statement of the Heart to be shown at the UN in New York early in 2023.

On Wednesday I gave two lectures, the first a 2 hour face-to-face lecture and the second a 1-hour on-line lecture, on how to reimagine research in a non-colonial way. This was to PhD students and early career researchers. These were the last in the series of such lectures I started at the beginning of the year. Following that I met with Aunty Matilda House who is a significant local elder and whom I met at the Launch of the Aquawhen exhibition late in 2021.

Finally, I met with another researcher looking at artistic strategies to bring the voice of the two rivers mentioned above together in a video/audio installation. This will be exciting if he is able to make it happen.

On the flight up I sat next Aunty Jill Gallagher, the CEO of the Victorian Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (VACCHO). It was great to have some time with her and to listen to her understandings of the Statement of the Heart (she helped write it) and the need for Voice in the Constitution.

All up, a great few days.

From the Organist

Edward B. Plumptre (1821 - 1891) wrote the text of the Offertory Hymn in 1864 when he was chaplain at King's College, London, during which time health and healing were obviously on his mind, as they continue to be for us today.

However, the way we talk about disease and disability has changed dramatically. The concept of wholeness - as in 'physical perfection' - is outdated. As I'm sure, like me, you have friends who are blind or deaf or hard-of-hearing or non-verbal (we'll learn about autism this weekend) who are complete and perfect in themselves.

But in some respects, I think Edward was ahead of his time. 'Troubled friend' could easily refer to mental health and there is something beautiful and metaphorical about the breath of God fixing those parts of us in need of love and care to make us well and productive.

Edward's underlying wish is clear: that there be a shared humanity free of pain and suffering. That's a message I can support wholeheartedly.

A Reading from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy

[2 Timothy 2: 8—15]

⁸ Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David—that is my gospel, ⁹ for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. ¹⁰ Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. ¹¹ The saying is sure: If we have died with him, we will also live with him; ¹² if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he will also deny us; ¹³ if we are faithless, he remains faithful—for he cannot deny himself. ¹⁴ Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. ¹⁵ Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.
