Notice is hereby given that the Annual Meeting of St. Oswald's Glen Iris will be held at 11.30am on Sunday 4 December 2022 in the Church following the normal 10am service.

From the Organist

This week I was caring for an elderly friend who lives alone and had a fall at home. It seemed, for a while at least, as if Death was lingering nearby. Feeling serious (and a little sacrosanct, if I'm honest), the words of Gabriel Urbain Fauré about his seminal work, Requiem Op. 48, surprised and shocked me: "My Requiem wasn't written for anything – for pleasure, if I may call it that!", he wrote.

Libera me, the movement you'll hear at mass, Fauré wrote in 1877 as an independent work which he later incorporated into the Op 48. It has great energy and is (dare I say it) great fun to perform and listen to, with its rolling drama moving from 4/4 to 6/4. And Fauré let's everyone in on the dramatic theme at the closing chorus - feel free to join in!

The composer continued: "It has been said that my Requiem does not express the fear of death and someone has called it a lullaby of death. But it is thus that I see death: as a happy deliverance, an aspiration towards happiness above, rather than as a painful experience."

Thank you Mr Fauré for simultaneously bringing me back down to earth and lifting me up with your words and music! As St. Francis of Assisi said: "What else are the servants of God but his minstrels? Our job is to lift up people's hearts and move them to spiritual gladness."

Translation of the words of the Libera Me:

Deliver me, O Lord, from death eternal on that fearful day,

When the heavens and the earth shall be moved,

When thou shalt come to judge the world by fire.

I am made to tremble, and I fear, till the judgment be upon us, and the coming wrath,

When the heavens and the earth shall be moved.

That day, day of wrath, calamity, and misery, day of great and exceeding bitterness, When thou shalt come to judge the world by fire.

Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord: and let light perpetual shine upon them.

A Mordialloc Meander

Proceed down Warrigal Road, turning left at Nepean Highway through the first roundabout at Mordialloc to the second roundabout crossing the bridge over the Mordialloc Creek. Travel 150 metres then turn left into Attenborough Park (road comes up quickly). Then right at the creek and park near tables and toilet block.

See Melway Map 92 Ref. F2.

After lunch the walk is upstream to a bridge near Boundary Road, crossing over and returning on the north-side of the creek to the Mordialloc Station where we board the train to Parkdale (one stop). We continue down Parkers Road, crossing Beach Road then follow the trail back to the Mordialloc Pier where we then walk to the end and back then meander to the Bridge Hotel for coffee on the deck. Total distance is approximately 5.5 kilometres. Our cars are located a short distance away for our journey home.

For information there are ample toilets along this route and don't forget your MYKI Card, sunscreen, hat, water and lunch.

A fine day should see a lot of small boat activity on the Mordialloc Creek.
