Today we read St Luke's account of Jesus addressing the crowd about the cost of being a disciple. ### From the Organist

Slane, the tune to our recessional hymn, is a traditional Irish melody steeped in history. If you were to go to the Hill of Slane in Ireland today you would see the remains of several churches, some built over earlier artificial mounds dating back to the Neolithic era.

Not only the burial place of kings, the Hill of Slane is supposedly the site where St Patrick lit the paschal fire in 433AD in defiance of the High King Laoire who forbid any other fires while a festival fire on his hill, the Hill of Tara, which can be seen from the Hill of Slane some 16 km's away. The High King was so impressed that St Patrick had dared to defy him, the legend is that Laoire converted and became a supporter of St Patrick's work in Ireland.

The text comes to us thanks to translations from Middle Irish (c. 900-1000 AD) thanks to the translation works of Mary Elizabeth Byrne and Eleanor Hull. Known as a lorica, a prayer for protection, the words invoke God's spear and shield, and depict God as the High King or clan protector.

#### Racism - a Discussion

### Sunday 18 September, after 10am Service

Even at late as the last few weekends, we have seen again issues of racism on the football field directed towards Aboriginal players. And the debate gaining momentum towards the Statement from the Heart and a Voice to Parliament for First Nations people in this country has sparked a good deal of healthy debate, but also further racist comments from some.

The church is also not insulated from racism and racist comments. Glenn has shared with the Parish Council a substantial number of examples of racism and experiences as an Aboriginal person which are totally unacceptable. Some of these incidents have occurred in the Melbourne Anglican Diocese and even at St. Oswald's. Some of these racist remarks arise out of misunderstanding or ignorance, but others may have a malicious intent.

To help us all understand more about how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders see and experience racism, it is proposed to hold a discussion in church after the 10am service on Sunday 18 September. It will be led by Vicar Glenn and school chaplain Rev Helen Dwyer.

In relation to children and young people in particular, the recent Victorian law change on Child Safety Standards makes it absolutely mandatory that as a church we maintain child safe premises at all times, especially for Aboriginal children and young people. No racism can be tolerated.

We also want to respect Glenn as an Aboriginal and Wiradjuri man and ensure he is not subject to racist remarks. Glenn is more than happy to answer questions about his Aboriginal heritage and racism. However, as preparation for the discussion, and if you have not read Glenn's book, you are invited to learn about Glenn's story and his exposure to racism through his book "On Being Black Fella's Young Fella". Copies are available for loan or purchase in the Murnong Gallery at the church, or at the Leaf Bookshop in Ashburton.

This discussion will be a great educational opportunity for all of us to learn about racism and its impact, viewed from the position of a First Nations person. It will enable us to understand these issues more fully and help us to better inform others. Please come and bring you friends and family and stay for the discussion after the service on Sunday 18 September.

### A Reading from the Prophet Jeremiah

[Jeremiah 18: 1-11]

<sup>1</sup> The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord: <sup>2</sup> 'Come, go down to the potter's house, and there I will let you hear my words.' 3 So I went down to the potter's house, and there he was working at his wheel. <sup>4</sup> The vessel he was making of clay was spoiled in the potter's hand, and he reworked it into another vessel, as seemed good to him. <sup>5</sup> Then the word of the Lord came to me: <sup>6</sup> Can I not do with you, O house of Israel, just as this potter has done? says the Lord. Turn now, all of you from your evil way, and amend your ways and your doings.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother,To Philemon our dear friend and co-worker, <sup>2</sup> to Apphia our sister, to Archippus our fellow-soldier, and to the church in your house: <sup>3</sup> Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>4</sup> When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God <sup>5</sup> because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith towards the Lord Jesus. <sup>6</sup> I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ. <sup>7</sup> I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother. <sup>8</sup> For

this reason, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do your duty. <sup>9</sup> vet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love—and I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. <sup>10</sup> I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. 11 Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful both to you and to me. 12 I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. 13 I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel; <sup>14</sup> but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. 15 Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back for ever, <sup>16</sup> no longer as a slave but as more than a slave, a beloved brother—especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord. <sup>17</sup> So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. 18 If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. <sup>19</sup> I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your own self. 20 Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ. 21 Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I sav. <sup>22</sup> One thing more—prepare a guest room for me, for I am hoping through your prayers to be restored to you. <sup>23</sup> Epaphras, my fellow-prisoner in Christ Jesus, sends greetings to you, <sup>24</sup> and so do Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, and Luke, my fellow-workers. <sup>25</sup> The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit.
